

GOVERNMENT OF TELANGANA DRUGS CONTROL ADMINISTRATION



Press Note

The Drugs Control Administration, Telangana, with the assistance of the Police Department, caught a habitual offender named P. Lakshmi Narsaiah, who is a most-wanted accused in several spurious drug cases filed by the Drugs Control Administration, Telangana, and against whom nonbailable warrants have been pending for a long time.

P. Lakshmi Narsaiah was arrested at a lodge in Kachiguda, produced before the Judicial First Class Magistrate Court in Kamareddy, and remanded to the Central Prison at Nizamabad.

Officers from the Drugs Control Administration, Nizamabad, with the assistance of the Commissioner's Task Force, Nizamabad, traced a habitual offender, P. Lakshmi Narsaiah, who had been absconding for years.

P. Lakshmi Narsaiah is accused in several **spurious drug cases** filed by the Drugs Control Administration, Telangana.

Fifteen cases are pending against P. Lakshmi Narsaiah in the State. Nine cases are pending in Nizamabad, three in Armoor, two in Nalgonda, and one in Kamareddy. Non-bailable warrants are pending in certain cases, while summons are pending in a few others.

The accused, P. Lakshmi Narsaiah, was tracked from Proddutur to Hyderabad by DCA officers, Sri V. Srikanth, Drugs Inspector, Nizamabad Urban, and Sri A. Raja Reddy, Drugs Inspector, Kamareddy. He was caught in a lodge in Kachiguda with the assistance of the Commissioner's Task Force, Nizamabad, in the early hours of August 19th and produced before the Judicial First Class Magistrate Court, Kamareddy, on the same day.

The accused was remanded to the Central Prison at Nizamabad.

Officers from the Drugs Control Administration, including Dr. N. Narsaiah, Assistant Director, Nizamabad, Sri V. Srikanth, Drugs Inspector, Nizamabad Urban, and Sri A. Raja Reddy, Drugs Inspector, Kamareddy, along with officers from the Commissioner's Task Force, Nizamabad, including Sri S. Vishnu Murthi, Assistant Commissioner of Police, Sri M. Rajeshwar, Head Constable, and Sri Narsaiah, Constable, participated in this operation.

Spurious drugs are a major threat to public health. Spurious drugs place the patient's health at grave risk. Spurious drugs not only fail to cure the disease but over time, create disastrous consequences for the patient.
