Press Note No. 21/DCA/2025

Drugs Control Administration, Telangana raided a quack's clinic in Warangal and seized drugs stocked for sale.

Since January 2024, the DCA has registered cases against 147 quacks for the illegal stocking and sale of drugs.

The details are as follows:

On credible information, Drugs Control Administration officials, on 19th February, 2025 raided the premises of a quack/unqualified practitioner Gaddam Srinivas, at D. No. 18-1-130/1, Urus Warangal, Warangal District, who was conducting clinical practice without proper qualifications at his clinic.

During the raid, DCA officials detected 14 varieties of medicines, including antibiotics, steroids, analgesics, etc. stocked at the premises without a drug licence. Worth of the stock seized is Rs. 10,000/-.

DCA officials detected several 'antibiotics' viz. Gentamycin at the clinic during the raids. Indiscriminate sale of antibiotics, by unqualified persons may have disastrous consequences on the health of public, including emergence of 'Antimicrobial Resistance'.

Officials found 'steroids' viz. Dexamethasone at the clinic of the quack. Misusing steroids can have serious health consequences, including immune

system suppression, hormonal imbalances, muscle and bone weakness, cardiovascular problems, and psychological effects. The indiscriminate use of steroids poses significant risks to public health.

Sri. M. Aravind Kumar, Drugs Inspector, Warangal carried out the raid under the supervision of Dr. G. Rajyalakshmi, Assistant Director, Warangal.

DCA officers lifted the samples for analysis. Further investigation will be carried out, and action will be taken as per the law against all the offenders.

Wholesalers/Dealers who supply medicines to such unqualified persons, who are stocking and selling drugs without a drug license, are also punishable under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, and stringent action shall be taken against such Wholesalers/Dealers. Wholesalers/Dealers shall mandatorily ensure that the recipient entities hold a valid drug license before supplying medicines to them.

Drugs Control Administration, Telangana, issues drug licenses for the stocking and selling of medicines in accordance with the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act.

Stocking drugs for sale without a drug license is punishable under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, with imprisonment for up to five years.

The public may report any suspected manufacturing activity related to drugs, including narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, in residential, commercial, or industrial areas, as well as any other complaints regarding illegal activities concerning medicines, through the Drugs Control

Administration, Telangana Toll-Free Number 1800-599-6969, which is operational from 10:30 am to 5:00 pm on all working days.
